

You Yangs Regional Park

Education Program

Guided education programs at the You Yangs enable students to engage with woodland habitat and understand the importance of the park to the local Wadawurrung people. Students can walk amongst granite peaks and take part in hands-on activities.

The You Yangs supports a rich variety of plant species including tall eucalypts such as Manna Gum, Yellow Gum, River Red Gum and an undergrowth of native shrubs and groundcovers. Home to over 200 species of birds, the You Yangs provides habitat for wildlife such as koalas, kangaroos, wallabies, echidnas and lizards.

What we offer

The You Yangs programs addresses aspects of the History and Geography Victorian Curriculum for levels 3 – 6 and 9 – 10.

Discovering Wadawurrung:

Levels: 3 – 6

Key learning areas: History, Geography

Students explore the cultural significance of the You Yangs Regional Park to the local Wadawurrung people.

Students observe key features of the landscape that are vital to the survival of Wadawurrung people while gaining an understanding of the importance of Country and Place. Students explore Big Rock and learn about uses of plants, traditional tools, shelters and rock wells.

You Yangs Geography Fieldwork:

Levels: 9 – 10

Key learning area: Geography (Environmental change and management)

Students undertake the East-West walk and explore a rocky landscape covered with tall eucalypts, shrubs and groundcovers.

Students investigate how certain factors influence the growth of native plants on the walk and how the landscape around the walk has changed over time. The students discover what negative impacts humans have had on the walk and how these impacts should be managed.
